

Frequently Asked Questions:

What is the J.H. Elliott History Forum?

The J.H. Elliott History Forum is a charity which has the objects to preserve, promote and disseminate the intellectual legacy of Sir John Elliott, Regius Professor of Modern History at the University of Oxford between 1991 and 1997, by means of supporting individuals and institutions engaged in the fields of his research, and encouraging future generations to share an interest in history and an awareness of its role in shaping global events. This is an initiative of the Elliott family and a group of disciples and collaborators of Sir John Elliott, namely: Harald E. Braun, Xavier Gil, Richard L. Kagan, Giuseppe Marcocci, Geoffrey Parker, and Molly Warsh.

Registration

How do I register for the conference?

- Registration for the symposium is compulsory and tickets must be booked via this link https://buytickets.at/jhelliotthistoryforum/1596310
- Day one and day two need to be booked as separate tickets.
- There are limited spaces available for dinner on the Friday evening at the Clore Library, additional booking is required.

Is there a registration fee?

- Day one of the symposium has no fee, yet booking is required.
- Day Two requires booking. The standard rate includes access to coffee, tea and a generous sandwich lunch. There is also an option to attend without lunch.
- It is free for current graduate and undergraduate students at the University of Oxford with limited tickets including lunch, £15 for Early Career Researcher at the University of Oxford with refreshments included and £5 without refreshments, and £35 for general registration including refreshments and £10 without lunch.
- Additional booking is required for dinner on day two, which costs £35.

What is the deadline for registration?

• Registration for the conference will close on 30 April 2025 at midday.

Who can attend the symposium?

• The symposium is open to the public, students, and postholders.

Do I need to bring anything with me?

• No, just check-in when you arrive.

Travel and Accommodation

How do I get to the venue?

Day One (Turl St, Exeter College):

• By Train - Arrive at Oxford Railway Station:

- o Trains to Oxford run frequently from London Paddington, London Marylebone, and other major cities.
- o The distance from the station to Turl Street, Exeter College: It's about a 15-20-minute walk. Exit the station and head east on Park End Street. Turn left onto Hythe Bridge Street, then right onto George Street. Continue onto Cornmarket Street, then turn left onto Turl Street. Exeter College will be on your left. Taxis are available outside the station. The journey takes about 5–10 minutes.

• By Car

- o Use the A34 or M40 to reach Oxford. Follow signs for the city centre.
- Park and Ride: Use one of Oxford's Park & Ride services (e.g., Pear Tree, Redbridge, or Thornhill). Take the bus into the city centre and walk to Turl Street.
- City Centre Parking: There are several car parks in Oxford, such as the Westgate Shopping Centre Car Park or the Gloucester Green Car Park. From there, it's a 5–10-minute walk to Exeter College.

• Is there parking available?

o No. However, there are public car parks in Oxford listed here:

Westgate Shopping Centre Car Park Address: Oxpens Rd, Oxford OX1 1TR Distance to Turl Street: 10-minute walk

Details: A large, modern car park with plenty of spaces. Convenient for shopping and dining before or after your visit.

Gloucester Green Car Park

Address: Gloucester St, Oxford OX1 2BN Distance to Turl Street: 10-minute walk

Details: Located near the bus station, this car park is central and easy to access.

Worcester Street Car Park

Address: Worcester St, Oxford OX1 2BX Distance to Turl Street: 10-minute walk

Details: A smaller car park but very close to the city centre.

Oxpens Car Park

Address: Oxpens Rd, Oxford OX1 1RQ Distance to Turl Street: 15-minute walk

Details: A larger car park with reasonable rates, located near the Westgate Centre.

St Clement's Car Park

Address: St Clement's St, Oxford OX4 1AB Distance to Turl Street: 15-minute walk

Details: A smaller car park located east of the city centre, ideal if other car parks are full.

Day Two (Cohen Quad):

By train –


 Cohen Quad is a 5-minute walk from Oxford Station, via Hythe Bridge Street and Worcester Street.

• By car –

O If you are driving to Oxford it is advisable to use the Park and Ride service. There are five large Park and Ride areas on the city approaches, some with free car parking and frequent bus services into the city centre. A list of city centre car parks is given above.

• By coach

o The main coach station is in Gloucester Green off George Street. Cohen Quad is a short walk from the coach station.



Are there recommended hotels nearby?

 Yes. Luxury Hotels: The Old Parsonage Hotel; the Randolph Hotel; The Old Bank Hotel. Mid-Range Hotels: Malmaison Oxford; The Buttery Hotel; Vanbrugh House Hotel. Budget Hotels: Premier Inn Oxford City Centre
